The top selling cow/calf pair was consigned by Stovall Livestock Stuart, Virginia, the cow was a four year old daughter of G A R Expectation 4915 bred to calve this fall to the service of Creekstone Lucy Boy 9004 and she sold for \$1,150 to Bud Phillips of Coeburn, Virginia, her 11-4-06 bull calf sired by Echo Ridge Rito 0014 9014 sold for \$1,350 to Mary Quesberry of Dugspur, Virginia. Total of this pair was \$2,500. The second top selling pair was a consignment of Justafew Angus, Max Meadows, Virginia, the cow was a four year old daughter of Bon View New Design 1407 bred to calve 12-13-06 to S S Objective T510 026 and she sold for \$1,075 to Larry Banks of Hillsville, Virginia. Her heifer calf was born on 12-8-06 sired by Mytty In Focus sold for \$1,000 to Lawson Farm of Ewing, Virginia. Total of this pair was \$2,075. The top selling bred cow was a consignment of Smith Angus Farm, Cleveland, Virginia., the cow was a three year old daughter of G A R Expectation 4915 bred to calve this fall to the service of Mytty In Focus and she sold for \$1,925 to Hawk Farm/Mary Joe Hanes of Danbury, N. C. The second top selling bred cow was a consignment of Touchstone Farm, Union Hall, Virginia, the cow was a three year old daughter of B C C Bushwacker 41-93 bred to calve this fall to the service of G A R Predestined and she sold for \$1,700 to Stovall Livestock of Stuart, Virginia.
